RESOLUTION NUMBER 17-3.12

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, OF MARTIN COUNTY, FLORIDA IN SUPPORT OF HOUSE BILL (HB) 259 RELATING TO THE CREATION OF THE VILLAGE OF INDIANTOWN AND HOUSE BILL (HB) 261 RELATING TO THE CREATION OF THE TOWN OF HOBE SOUND LOCATED WITHIN MARTIN COUNTY, FLORIDA.

**WHEREAS**, certain residents of the Hobe Sound community and Indiantown community have submitted a request to the Florida legislature for Special Acts, to permit incorporation of each Community pursuant to Section 165.041 Fla. Stat.; and

**WHEREAS**, the same residents of the Hobe Sound and Indiantown communities requested of the Board of County Commissioners, at its March 6, 2017 meeting, support for HB 259, which would create the Village of Indiantown, and HB 261 which would create the Town of Hobe Sound if supported by voter referendum; and

**WHEREAS**, both HB 259 and HB 261 include language which requires that the legislation's effectiveness is subject to approval by a majority vote of those qualified electors residing within the corporate limits of the municipality (Village of Indiantown/Town of Hobe Sound) voting in a referendum; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has determined it is in the best interest of the residents of Martin County to support HB 259 and HB 261 to provide the residents of the Hobe Sound and Indiantown communities the opportunity to vote on the issue of incorporation by referendum.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MARTIN COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:**

1. The Martin County Board of County Commissioners supports House Bill (HB) 259 proposed by Representative MaryLynn Magar (R-District 82).
2. The Martin County Board of County Commissioners supports House Bill (HB) 261 proposed by Representative MaryLynn Magar (R-District 82).
